

# Ripple Stitch Scarf

Easy increases and decreases create the pretty rippled stitch pattern; a variegated yarn in shades of purple and blue creates the soothing color combination.

## RIPPLE PATTERN

(multiple of 12 sts plus 2)

**Row 1 (RS)** K1, \*[k2tog] twice, [k1, yo] 4 times, [k2tog] twice; rep from \*, end k1.

**Rows 2 and 3** Knit.

**Row 4** Purl.

Rep rows 1–4 for ripple pat.

## NOTE

When changing to a new skein of yarn, try to begin the new strand close to the last color used from the previous skein, to keep the continuity of the stripe pat.

## SCARF

Cast on 26 sts. K 2 rows. Work in ripple pat until piece measures approx 74½"/189cm from beg, ending with a pat row 3. K 2 rows.

Bind off all sts knitwise on WS. ✪

## SKILL LEVEL



## MATERIALS

- 3 skeins of *Serenity Chunky Weight* by Deborah Norville Collection/Premier Yarns, 3½oz/100g skeins, each approx 109yd/100m (fine acrylic) in #7 memphis blues
- One pair size 10½ (6.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE

## KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- One size.

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

- Approximately 7 x 75"/17.5 x 190.5cm

## GAUGE

- 15 sts and 19 rows to 4"/10cm over ripple pat using size 10½ (6.5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.
